St. Patrick's Catholic Church of Mount Dora Florida, with its limited resources, has annual mission trips to Dominica Republic to build homes, class rooms and provide medical care to some areas in need. Some of the major challenges and needs:

Natural Disasters | Annual danger of devastation presented by the hurricane season.

Broken Families | Many of the region's children are being cared for by single mothers or relatives.

Sex Trafficking | Many innocent children are forced into sex trafficking, which proliferates in the country's tourist centers.

Education | Children frequently quit school to look for work to help improve their families' economic situation. The failure rate among students is high.
